Identifying Reputable Substance Use Treatment Providers



The Right Help, Right Here.

Determining whether a service provider is reputable is not always straightforward. Look for these FIVE indicators to help you identify a provider as trustworthy and credible:



They have easily identifiable contact information and a physical address.



They are clear and up-front about costs. There should not be surprises about insurance deductibles, co-pays, and other out-of-pocket expenses.



They have a policy of no "kickbacks" or referrals. Reputable programs will not pay for patient referrals and or engage in patient brokering practices, which are illegal.



They have a very clear step-down or discharge process focused on continuing care.



They are licensed by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) and accredited by an organization like the Joint Commission Accreditation or Addiction Treatment (JCAHO)'s Gold Seal for Behavioral or a certification of the Commission on Accrediation of Rehab Facilities (CARF).
